The President's Message

The annual Members Meeting of the Executive Estates of Boynton Beach Homeowners Association, Inc. (Citrus Glen) was held on January 31, 2006 at 7:30 P.M.. I as President, was very disappointed with the attendance and participation of the membership meeting of the Executive Board. This is the most crucial meeting of the year!! I expressed concern and wondered if our community wanted to continue with an Association. Once again, members had to go to get additional proxies to be able to conduct the meeting and elect the required Board members. After we got the quorum, only two members, Mr. Kauzlick and Mr. Wagner were willing to accept nominations to run for the board. Since there was no more nominations, Mr. Kauzlick and Mr. Wagner were elected. Therefore, we are one board member short. Mrs. Lotridge volunteered to find a third Board Member to be appointed at the next Board Meeting to serve for the period 2006-2007.

The Board thanks Mrs. Heidi Kauzlick for the great service performed while chairing the landscaping committee. Due to scheduling conflict Mrs. Kauzlick has had to resign from her position.

The Property Manager reported the progress in obtaining providers to continue with the recovery of the community from the last hurricane. The board approved a tree trimming provider to start working during the last week of February. Our landscaping company started to replace the

sod in various areas and will continue to do so for the next month.

We have received many complaints regarding dogs running loose without a leash and no one picks up after them. Please be aware that State, County and City regulations as well as community rules, require that dogs be kept on a leash while on common grounds and owners need to pick up after them. To allow the animals to do their business without someone picking up after them creates an unsanitary condition that can't be ignored. The property manager is issuing violation notices to residents and will send the violators to the attorney to get injunctions to have the regulations complied with. It seems hard to believe that we need to go to these extreme measures to stop a condition that everyone should be willing to correct. We all understand that no one likes to report a neighbor for a violation. However, when the neighbor becomes inconsiderate and selfish, there is a time to put a stop to the problem.

Problems and request for landscaping, including sprinklers, should now be reported to the Property Manager (*Christina*) for action.





Dogs: 1.) It shall be unlawful for any dog to be off the owner's property (which property is exclusive to the owner and does not include common areas) unless the dog is under the restraint or control of a person by means of a chain, leash or other device or is sufficiently near its handler to be under his direct control and is obedient to that handler's commands or is caged/crated.

2.) It shall be unlawful for an owner to tie, chain, tether or confine by electronic/radio device a dog on the owner's property within five (5) feet of public property, public access, easements, common grounds or the property of another without the consent of the owner of such property

The state, County, City and Community require that dogs be on a leash and some one to clean up after them.

History of St. Patrick

St. Patrick was born in Roman Britain, around 389.

When he was 16, he was sold into slavery to Ireland where he was a shepherd for six years. While in captivity, he studied and turned to religion. He escaped slavery and later returned to Ireland as a missionary, determined to convert Ireland to Christianity. He used the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity. He was ordained as Bishop of Ireland in 431.

He was able to secure tolerance for Christians in Ireland during his life there.

He is also said to have drummed the snakes from Ireland and into the sea.

He is said to have died in 461 and to be buried in Downpatrick.

St. Patrick's Cathedral in Dublin was built in the 12th Century.
